The apprenticeship programme offered by Swim UK allows individuals working in the leisure industry the opportunity to gain a range of qualifications whilst training to become a fully qualified swimming teacher.

The apprenticeship enables individuals to gain experience in teaching swimming whilst gaining their ASA/UKCC Level 1 and/or Level 2 Teaching Aquatics Qualification. The experience individual's gain from the apprenticeship is invaluable and is fundamental in helping them progress and build as a teacher. It usually takes around 6-12 months to complete and once completed they will be a fully qualified swimming teacher.
